Workshop: "Whiteboard"

Schools: Menyeh Blatt public school, North, grade 7 (15 students)

Menyeh Al Hekr mixed-gender public school, North, grade 7 (12 students)

During this workshop, students discovered the essential elements in photography with Chantale Fahmi as well as the importance of reading and framing a photo.

With Ibtisam Dib, students learned about paper recycling and the positive impact it has on the nature. Each student made his own paper that was later transformed into an artwork that hold thin black lines and shapes drawing the future they aspire to have.

Workshop: Graffiti fundamentals

School: Wata el Msaytbeh Public school, grade 7 (15 students)

The workshop was designed to provide a broad understanding of the international and local history of graffiti and the sub-cultures aligned with it.

From there, the students were presented with various styles and techniques to sketch their graffiti names on paper.

Finally, all students worked together to paint a graffiti they designed together directly on a wall using the techniques and skills they learned.














A heartwarming story

School: Mtein mixed-gender public middle school, Matn

grades 4, 5, 6 (22 students)

Reflecting on today's reality and the state of daily struggles, the students engaged in a common experience around a dream world each and everyone hopes for.

They compared abstract paintings from the BEMA – MoC Collection with Marc Chagall's poetic work to release their expressive imagination.

After sketching their world of dreams, they painted together on large canvases manifesting their diversity and collaboration.















Workshop: A World to Come

School: Tarik El Jdideh 2 middle mixed-gender public school, Beirut grade 8 (18 students)

"A World to Come" is a collaborative art project that aims to trigger the investigation around each individual's role in shaping the future and how every action is taken today whether individually or collectively, leaves an imprint on the "world to come".

The students learned the basics of wire sculpting, then experimented with wires to create artworks based on their vision of the present and the future.

Workshop: It's Your Choice

School: Deir Kifa middle public school, South, grade 5 (22 students)

Answering this year's theme pupils confronted the concept of sustainability, generated plant-based primary colors, and inquired about the chemistry behind natural dyes.

"It is your choice" Is a multi-layered art-related activity that engaged the students in decoding simplified geometric representations, where they got to know the basic principles and elements of design and manifested a contemporary body of work with an alternative twist.
